

WHO WE ARE

Greater Regional Health is a healthcare system located in Creston, lowa. It is made up of multiple clinics and services, as well as over 550 employees, to best serve our patients of Southwest Iowa and beyond.

GRH is an affiliate partner with UnityPoint Health in Des Moines through both a formal management agreement and a Critical Access Hospital network agreement. This relationship enables GRH to retain its governance structure while taking advantage of greater system-wide resources, clinical platforms, best practices and many other advantages which benefit the people in our community. GRH remains locally governed by a Board of Trustees and key administration positions to oversee the day-to-day operations of the hospital and its employees.

GRH is a 25 bed critical access hospital that offers a range of care including Intensive Care (ICU), Acute Care and Swing Bed/Skilled Care. There is also a state-of-the-art Birthing Center, Cancer & Infusion Center, Rehabilitation Center and Sleep Center.

Four rural health clinics are conveniently located in Lenox, Mt. Ayr, Corning, and Greenfield. These clinics offer primary care close to home and work closely with the specialists located on our main Creston campus when needed.

The newest addition to GRH, is the former Crossroads building aquired this summer. Plans are in motion to use this for administrative offices and a conference room. The East Medical Suites provide additional clinic space for specialty service lines and Union County Public Health and our Visiting Providers Clinic continue to provide care at Highway Medical in Creston. Crest Ridge Estates is a secure, private senior apartment complex located next door to the main GRH campus. Patients can obtain medical records and other information from the Health Information Center located on the lower level of Crest Ridge.



Strained by limited access, provider shortages, and an aging population with complex health needs, many rural healthcare systems may find themselves struggling to meet the needs of their patients. Over the last 60 years, Greater Regional Health has worked to address unique challenges, expand access to care, and create innovative solutions for our patients.

Greater Regional Health has evolved from a county hospital into a unique healthcare system made up of multiple clinics, services, and locations spanning across southwest Iowa. Our first rural health clinic opened its doors in Lenox 30 years ago. These expansions were solely investments made by Greater Regional Health, meaning no tax dollars or incentives were used for the new facilities.

Our goal has never been to displace healthcare options already in place in these communities, but rather expand access to and provide choices in quality care. We believe when people have a choice in their care, the quality improves or remains high, ensuring these communities have access to the best care possible.

Being able to support and collaborate with community partners is beneficial not only for our patients, but for the community. Therefore, we continue to reinvest in these communities through sponsorships and donations.

We currently have clinics located in Lenox, Mt. Ayr, Corning, and Greenfield. The primary care providers located at our rural clinics can diagnose and treat most common disease and medical conditions. When further care is necessary, they can coordinate and provide access to a wide variety of specialty services located at our main campus, providing the type of care you would expect in a big city, close to home.

Greenfield Medical Clinic

The Greenfield Medical Clinic opened on February 12, 2024 on the historic downtown square in Greenfield, Iowa. It was an honor to work with Greenfield's Historic Preservation Commission to renovate an important piece of architecture to the square. The renovation project invested money back into the community without affecting taxpayers.

An open house and ribbon cutting took place in May to celebrate the grand opening of Greenfield Medical Clinic. Community members were encouraged to take tours of the newly renovated space and meet our two full-time providers, Demi O'Brien, MD, and Laura Hagen, ARNP, who provide primary care, x-ray, podiatry, and prenatal services.

The Greenfield Medical Clinic continues to serve many of our former patients at the new location and welcomes new patients every day. Both providers are accepting new patients and are available for same-day appointments. We look forward to continuing and building trusted relationships while providing the best possible care for our patients.

Iowa is one of the few states in the nation where the number of obstetricians per capita is incredibly low. From 2000 to 2018, there were 33 labor and delivery unit closures in Iowa. As a result, women in rural areas often have limited access to obstetric care, and many must travel long distances for prenatal visits, labor, and delivery. For many expectant mothers, this added travel can be stressful, time-consuming, and exhausting.

Greater Regional Health has become one of the few OB units still left operating in southwest lowa. We are committed to making sure that women don't have to leave their communities to receive the best obstetric care available. By having three delivering providers on our team, we're able to ensure consistent, high-quality care that's close to home.

In addition to convenience, there is often comfort in knowing who will be delivering your baby. Smaller communities allow for long-lasting and trusted relationships that you may not experience in larger birthing centers.

"In 2004, I arrived in Creston with a dream to stay in one place long enough to deliver a patient I had delivered as a baby and been her physician her whole life," said Dr. Krogstad. "My favorite part of family practice is to deliver babies and then watch them grow up. Teenage boys "love it" when I tell them at their sports physical that I was the first one to hold them as a baby. I have been truly blessed to be the physician for 5 generations of families. Growing up as a farm kid in North Dakota, I knew a small town would allow me to build meaningful relationships with entire families as a family doctor. Creston has been a great place to do that the past 20 years."

Greater Regional Health prioritizes healthy initiatives not only in our hospital and clinics but also within the communities we serve. A healthy community is one in which all residents have access to a quality education, safe and healthy homes, adequate employment, transportation, physical activity, and nutrition, in addition to quality health care. Greater Regional Health chooses to reinvest in projects to promote an overall healthy community.

As a county hospital, Greater Regional Health is governed by Iowa Code Chapter 347, its board bylaws, and hospital policies and procedures. Initiatives are supported if it is financially suitable to do so each fiscal year. The hospital has not raised taxes in 20 years and will not raise taxes to support community reinvestment projects.

Greater Regional Health uses feedback from community and staff surveys to determine which reinvestment initiatives would most benefit the community. Union County Public Health conducted a Community Health Needs Assessment in 2022. The results of this survey have helped identify the key health needs in the community. It also helps develop a health improvement plan by justifying how and where resources should be allocated to best meet community needs. The growth achieved by Greater Regional Health over the last 5 years has made it possible to support a variety of community reinvestment initiatives.

JOUR HEALTH CARE

The Greater Regional Healthcare Foundation was established in 1993 with the mission of providing support and enhancements to the health and well-being of the communities we serve through the purchase of new equipment, improving patient experience, educational opportunities and other projects. Generous donations through memorials, annual giving, and fundraising efforts have made a significant contribution to the experience of local health care and wellness opportunities.

2024 was filled with exciting events and contributions. The Foundation was proud to sponsor of the Creston Farmers Market for the sixth year. Greater Regional Health, employees and Foundation donated \$20,000 to the Greenfield Community Betterment Foundation for tornado relief. Other items donated included \$35,000 towards improvements to the gazebo and arboretum area, as well as continued funding for PANS travel and lodging support for patients and their families.



The Foundation hosted its 33rd annual golf event at Crestmoor. 45 teams competed and the event raised over \$38,000. The event designated funds toward the Auxiliary's annual healthcare scholarships and two Panda baby warmers for the Birthing Center.

Fundraising to support the Greater Regional Cancer and Infusion Center occurred throughout 2024. Funds raised have been utilized for a hip and breast board for radiation therapy, sponsorship of a wig program, gas cards and other materials for the department. The Crush Cancer in Every Color event raised \$22,326 to be designated toward local cancer care. Greater Regional also hosted pink outs at Creston and East Union football and volleyball games. In conjunction with pink out shirt sales, these events raised over \$3,000 for the cancer center.

The Foundation appreciates the support of our community and generous gifts from our donors and looks forward to continuing to enhance the excellent care provided by Greater Regional Health.
